## WHAT IS THE NEXT LARGE STEP FOR OUR SMALL GROUPS?

Sunrise Chapel has a long history of offering small group activities to help people grow spiritually. For example, for over 25 years, many, many people have benefited from the Spiritual Growth Groups developed by Frank and Louise Rose.

In the past 8 years we have added the annual 7-week Journey Program to our winter schedule. We also support the local community by providing space for a variety of small group meetings such as the long-standing Tuesday night Bereavement Support Group, as well as seven different 12-step meetings throughout each week. We have other groups that meet on an as-needed basis.

As a church community, I think we need to be asking a very important organizational question – How can we transition from being a church that supports some small groups to becoming a thriving network of small groups that supports the church?

### A New Effort

I’m excited to announce that on March 4 & 5, a “travel team” of 4 people from Sunrise Chapel will attend a 2-day workshop designed to supercharge our small groups ministry. Thanks to a generous grant through the General Church Office of Outreach, we will join representatives from other New Church congregations at the retreat center of Saddleback Valley Community Church near Anaheim, California. Our expert facilitator will be Steve Gladen, Pastor of Saddleback’s

Small Group Community. This 2-day deep-dive planning workshop will focus on how to articulate and implement a strategy for building up our small group ministry.

Our enthusiastic travel team consists of **Élise Gladish, Art Watson, Kelly Woofenden, and me.** In preparation, we are each reading the book **Small Groups with Purpose**, by Steve Gladen. Since we are traveling in one car together to and from California, we will have hours to discuss items and questions ahead of time and debrief afterwards.

### The “Home Team” - How you can help!

In order for Sunrise Chapel to fully benefit from this important one-time workshop, our travel team needs the support of a larger home team before and after the workshop! And I’m **not** talking about financial support.

- We need your prayers and encouragement for the Lord’s inspiration and guidance.

- And we need your ongoing participation to help see real changes that stick.

Daily Bible study is a wonderful and enriching way to ground your spiritual growth work. The program workbook provides ideas for daily reading from Scripture, along with suggestions for bringing these ideas into life. The workbook is available in print or as an eBook or by email subscription. There is also a leader's version and even a couple's version!

Many find the most enriching experience of the program is in a small group where people explore their faith and support each other in applying that faith to life. Each meeting is a wonderful smorgasbord of educational and inspirational items. The flow includes: beginning with opening prayer, a time for checking in (How are you?), individual reports on the task for the week (Peace Practice), Bible study, discussion of the upcoming weekly task, closing thoughts, and closing prayer.

You can join a small group at Sunrise Chapel or participate in an online videoconference. Or, start your own! It's easy with the step-by-step leader's edition workbook.

You are going to love this! Many, many people in the past have. Take the course with family and friends.

**TREASURER'S CORNER:  
DONATING TO SUNRISE CHAPEL  
ELECTRONICALLY**

**Q:** I have a question, Art. I love giving to Sunrise Chapel, but I don't like writing checks. How can I donate electronically?

**A:** I can relate. As time goes on, I write fewer checks. They are still necessary on occasion, but there are various electronic methods of transferring money that can make check-writing a thing of the past. And if you set up an automatic, recurring transaction, like a few others in our congregation are already doing, you can make it easier to give consistently. Speaking as Treasurer, that really, really helps me keep track of the budget!

It's simple to set up an electronic donation through your bank to Sunrise Chapel, and it costs absolutely nothing to either the sender or the church. Here is the basic process. The details may vary from bank to bank – but each institution tries to make it user-friendly.

- Determine the amount you want to give
- Decide the frequency of the donation (one-time, weekly, every other week, etc.)
- Contact your bank either online or in person to set up the bill pay feature

The bank will provide a simple form where you fill out the pertinent information. Some banks allow you to add a "Memo" for the transaction. You can use this feature if you want to specify what area of the budget you want your donation to go. Otherwise, just send me a note or speak to me in person. Unspecified donations will go into the General Fund.

The bank does the rest. If you set up an automatic pay, on the designated day of your choosing, your bank will cut a physical check for your specified dollar amount and mail it to Sunrise Chapel. There is no charge. They even pay the postage. Once the check is received by your Treasurer, it is treated just the same as if it was hand-delivered in the donations basket.

We are also working on setting up the option for you to donate with your credit or debit card. Stay tuned for updates on this feature.
